

Dr.K.C.G.'s corner

Recap: In 1977, Dr. K.C.G. Verghese and his wife Elizabeth went on a world tour. They visited the Niagara Falls, the Empire State Building and the World Trade Centre. Their cousin Mr. Jacob drove them to Kennedy Airport to take the flight to London. Mr and Mrs Verghese were flying from Kathmandu to London when a major power failure plunged New York City into darkness. Stranded planes lined up for take-off as they waited for clearance to begin their journey. They were flying at 30,000 feet when the pilot announced the sighting of Mount Everest.



One day Dr. K.C.G Verghese received a call from the Archbishop of Mylapore. The Archbishop wanted Dr. Verghese to arrange a flight for Mother Teresa to travel from Chennai to Pondicherry. She was going to inaugurate a ceremony in the Church and she was too frail to make the journey by road.

Dr. Verghese had a twin - engine Piper Seneca aircraft, which regularly operated between Pondicherry and other smaller airstrips in the country. The airport at Pondicherry was too small for the bigger aircraft. Dr. Verghese decided that the Piper Seneca would be ideal for this flight and he went ahead with the arrangements.

On the appointment day, Dr. Verghese went to the airport to oversee the flight arrangements. Mother Teresa arrived from Kolkata and made her way to their aircraft. She was accompanied by the Bishop of Pondicherry, the Archbishop of Mylapore and few Sisters of Missionaries of charity. As she walked to the aircraft, a large group of airport staff followed her and many more people bent to touch her feet. The police had a difficult time controlling the crowd.

When she reached the aircraft she tarried for a while and talked to Dr. Verghese. Then the Bishop of Pondicherry and the nuns boarded the aircraft. The Mother looked helplessly at the steps leading upto the aircraft. They were a few feet above the ground. It was evident that she would not be able to climb up.

Dr. Verghese expected the Bishop and nuns to make a move, but no one did. He realized that something had to be done. He lifted her up and took her

inside the plane. He placed her in the seat and locked her seat belt in place. Dr. Verghese could see that everyone was taken aback. But he didn't care. He had Divinity in his hands.

Dr. Verghese waited until the aircraft engines were switched on and then he got out of the aircraft and returned to the airport terminal. As the flight moved down the runway at high speed and took off, he experienced a strange feeling of uneasiness. He was worried what if something happened to the aircraft as they were carrying someone who was really indispensable for the country.

The plane moved to the South and soon disappeared among the white clouds. Dr. Verghese's restlessness increased. He met the Airport Manager and told him that he would like to monitor the flight. He was permitted to go to the Air Traffic Control tower. From there he could talk to the pilot. The radar would indicate the movement of the aircraft, its position and its height from the ground. The ATC officials asked Dr. Verghese to be seated and offered him a cup of coffee.

Dr. Verghese and his son Anand had gone to Blackpool, U.K., to purchase the aircraft. The owner of the aircraft was a businessman who was manufacturing and marketing engineering goods all over Europe. When Dr. Verghese and his son arrived at the airport, he asked them if they were ready to fly the plane. Dr. Verghese replied in affirmative. The businessman opened the hangar and Dr. Verghese and Mr. Anand helped the businessman to push the aircraft from the hangar and on the runway. There was a strong wind and heavy rain outside. The man's willingness to fly in this weather was remarkable. Dr. Verghese told that he was ready, though deep in his heart he was afraid.

Dr. Verghese asked his son Anand to stay back. The businessman and Dr. Verghese took off. The clouds were free from the wind and rain and they flew around the city of Blackpool for about forty five minutes. The airplane was obviously in good condition. Soon after landing, they finalized the deal. Later the plane was flown to India.

The same aircraft had the good fortune of carrying Mother Teresa. When the flight finally landed in Pondicherry, Dr. Verghese was greatly relieved. He left home with an immense sense of satisfaction.

After returning to Chennai the next day, Mother Teresa presented small mementos to the pilots.


SWACCH BHARATH ABHIYAN
