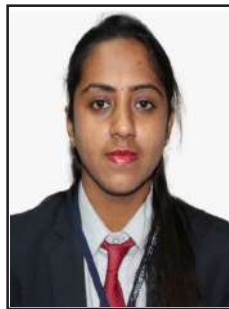

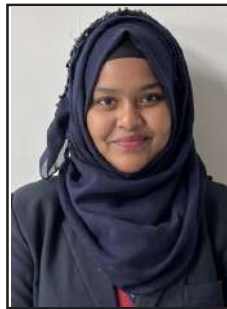

APPOINTMENT OF AREA PRESIDENT OF Y'S MEN INTERNATIONAL



On the 18th of September, during a ceremony held at The Hilton, Chennai, Dr. Anand Jacob Verghese, Managing Turstee, Hindustan College and Director & CEO, Hindustan Group of Institutions, Chennai was installed as the Area President of Y's Men International (YMI) – India Area for the year 2021-22. The installation was performed by the International President of Y's Men International, Dr. Kim Sang-Chae. The ceremony saw the presence of National and

International level leaders of the Y's Men International. Dr. Anand Jacob Verghese is a member of Y's Men's Club of Mylapore, South India Region, India Area, and served as the Regional Director of South India Region for two years from 2016-18. During his 2-year tenure, he achieved the Best Regional Director Award of India Area. He was also the Chairman of the 71st Y's Men International Convention held in 2014. The Area Presidents' slogan for the year is "New Thinking New Possibilities" and his theme is "Do it Yourself". Y's Men International's major project to be achieved during this year is "Renal Care and Dialysis" and their Unified Global Project is "YMI Heal the World". Along with these, other projects are planned like care for the Aged, Medical aid and support for COVID victims, Shelter for the homeless, Geriatric camps, etc.

SEMINAR ON AN OVERVIEW ON IMPLEMENTATION OF GST IN INDIA

Dr. K.C.G.'s corner

Recap: When Dr. Verghese sought permission to land at Pune airport, they told him that there was no space for parking the aircraft and hence he had to park it in Mumbai.

Dr. Verghese learnt that a Pune based friend of him, a business tycoon, who owned a private aircraft was not allowed to park it in Pune airport. The private airlines will be willing to pay for the services they get, like landing charges, parking charges and airport handling. Normally the aircraft is not allowed to come close to the airport terminal. So a vehicle is required to take the passengers and their luggage to the airport. Sometimes, the pilots have to walk all the way to the ATC in the blazing sun or the pouring rain.



Dr. K.C.G. VERGHESE

In Chennai, Dr. Verghese was associated with several service organisations such as the YMCA (Young Men's Christian Association) and the Y's Men's Club. The Chennai YMCA is one of the largest in Asia with over twenty thousand members. Dr. K C G Verghese was the President of YMCA for two terms and had the good fortune of work with senior leaders Like Nelson Isaac, Soundararajan, Freddy Ebenezar, Narasimha Rao, Cherian, Alexander and the late N. George, the founder of Alpha School. Together they involved in many projects, which enabled them to make their own humble contribution to the social and economic development of the community.

The YMCA and Y's Men International are partner organisations. For over a decade, Dr. Verghese has been actively involved in the philanthropic activities of Y's Men International. It was Dr. Verghese's Japanese friend, Kensuke Suzuki, Director of Toyota Motor Company, who inspired him to play an active role in Y's Men International.

The Y's Men's Club of Chennai has existed since 1940 and the International Movement has About Thirty Thousand Members in Eighty Countries. During the year 2000-2001, Dr. Verghese was chosen as the Area President (India) and International Council Member for the period 2001-2004. He had occasion to host the International Council Meeting at Chennai. The International Council has twenty-one elected representatives from different countries.

During this period, Ingvar Wallin, International Secretary General and Eric Kim, International President, visited Chennai along with other delegates. Dr. Verghese suggested them that they would like to host the next International Convention at Chennai. However, after visiting the hotels in the city and taking a look at the meagre facilities, they politely refused his offer. There would be over two thousand delegates and the hotels did not have convention halls large enough to accommodate them.

Years later, Dr. Verghese found that the port city of Cochin had a large new auditorium and he thought it was time to make another bid for International convention. It had never been held in India before. He decided to present their case at the International Council meeting to be held at Bloomington, near Chicago, in the year 2001. On his trip to the USA, he was accompanied by his friends, Samarjeet Gupta and G.K.Pattery. On the second day of the meeting, Mr. Wallin announced that there were only two bids for hosting the convention for the year 2004. The bids were from USA and India respectively, and the quotes were identical. The representatives of the bidding countries would be given five minutes each to present their cases.

The American representative, Mr. McKenzie, spoke first. He told the Council members that the proposed location was at San Diego, in California, which had world-class convention facilities, besides innumerable tourist attraction, excellent shopping malls, and connecting flights from all parts of the world. Silicon Valley, Hollywood and Disneyland were nearby. Dr. Verghese's heart sank. He felt as though he had already lost the bid. He was wearing an attractive jacket and a beautiful tie to boost his self-esteem, but his confidence hit rock bottom. The European Area President gave him an encouraging look. Dr. Verghese got up to speak. "We have no experience in arranging International Conventions in India," he explained, "This is the first time we are trying to organise a convention of this sort. We are likely to make mistakes but we assure you that all delegates will be comfortable and happy and no one will regret coming to India. We shall make arrangements for the delegates to visit the Taj Mahal at Agra and Mount Everest in Nepal. Cochin is a historical port city which St. Thomas, the Apostle, visited in the first century. The boat races on the backwaters are a treat to behold. I request all of you to give us this opportunity"

After Dr. Verghese sat down, the President announced that there would be a ten-minute coffee break followed by voting. When the meeting resumed, the ballot papers were distributed, and voting began. They waited with bated breath as the votes were counted. The announcement really took us by surprise. Nineteen of the twenty-one delegates had voted in favour of India. Pattery ran to the telephone to inform their friends in India.

The International Convention was held at Cochin in the year 2004. Several hundred delegates from all over the Convention. The District Governor M Prabakaran, the District Treasurer M Premkumar and District Service Directors C.P. Premkumar and G Palani helped them make that convention a great success. Mr. I K Gujral, Former Prime Minister of India was the guest of honour.
